

SAFE, UNSAFE TOUCHES

Govt launches sexual awareness videos aimed at teaching children about safe, unsafe touches

The Malaysian government has launched a series of videos to teach young children on sexual awareness, particularly involving safe and bad touches, says Deputy Prime Minister Dr Wan Azizah Wan Ismail.

In a collaboration with Google, these videos will be aired on YouTube in the form of one-minute advertisements on children's shows.

The Women, Family and Community Development Minister wanted children as early as the age of two to know the difference between safe and unsafe touches.

"We also want them to know what to do when these things happen, which is to run away from the person and alert their parents.

"We hope these videos will reach 150,000 children nationwide," she said at the video launch on Monday (June 24) in Putrajaya, near Kuala Lumpur.
